More and More People Online, But Still Work to Do

Just 18% of people in Europe have never used the Internet, according to the latest data published by Eurostat, the EU's statistics office. This marks a sharp decrease in the number of people who've never been online, from 43% in 2006. Across Europe, numbers vary for the number of people without experience of using the Internet: from 39% of people in Romania to only 3% in Denmark. The figures also showed that one in five people in Europe had used online file storage services. Read More
